Hot Topic: Radicalisation

You've probably heard a lot about Radicalisation, Extremism and Terrorism in the media; you may worry about how this might affect you, your family or your friends, so it is important you help prevent terrorism from happening by keeping yourself safe and looking out for others.

What is radicalisation? In simple terms, it's the path a person goes through towards supporting terrorist groups.

Why might a person become radicalised? People can be drawn to extremist views for many reasons which can make them vulnerable; these can include:

- >To feel a sense of identity, belonging or to be part of something
- > For adventure or excitement
- >They're under pressure from people linked with these groups
- > A personal grievance or experience of racism or being discriminated against

What can I do? Be aware of.....

- > People who may try to draw you, your family or your friends towards extreme ideas or groups ~ they may do this face to face or through social media
- > Changes in the language, views, behaviour or appearance of people around you

Where possible, avoid having items on display when you're out and about - keep them out of sight


Best not to take to school.. if you do, make sure its kept in a secure place

Register your stuff for free at 'immobilise' if it's lost/stolen and then recovered by the police, they will check immobilise to trace the owner and return it to them... click the logo to register or visit www.immobilise.com

THINK.. you don't just lose your gadget, photos, videos & contacts are lost too!




Take Over Day 20th November 2015




