Hot Topic: Violence... what does it solve??

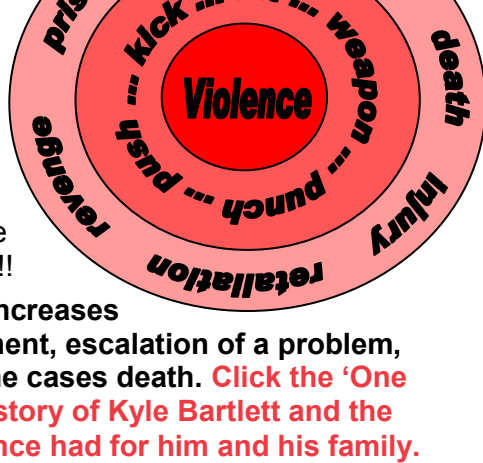
Violence is not the answer!!

The diagram shows acts of violence and consequences it can have for victims and offenders.

Ask yourself **'is it worth the risk?'**

The reality is that people don't normally plan to be violent; often it happens through a combination of **the situation, choices and actions.**

If you feel a disagreement or situation is getting out of hand and could get violent **STOP!!** Take a moment to think before you act, you have a choice to prevent bad consequences before they happen!!



Choosing violence over reason increases the risk of injury, police involvement, escalation of a problem, retaliation or revenge and in some cases death. Click the 'One Punch Can Kill' logo to read the story of Kyle Bartlett and the devastating consequences violence had for him and his family.

5 Things You Can Do To Stop Violence & Stay Safe

Use words, not fists or weapons: Violence doesn't resolve anything but talking can!

Don't be bystander: Watching doesn't help, it can be seen as being involved in the situation

If you've been threatened: If you feel you're in danger tell someone ~ if you're confronted, walk or run away and head to a place of safety

Alcohol and drugs: Being under the influence can increase the risk of violence being used.

Stick with friends and stay away from known trouble spots: Be aware of places that may be risky; if you feel you are in trouble, you feel scared or are in danger - get away, tell a parent, the school or the police
