As part of their Student Watch programme, led by PCSO Lee Thubron from Andover Police Station, students at Sparsholt College took part in the Police Apprentice Initiative on the topic of Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE). Police Apprentice sets young people the task to design ways to communicate messages and information to other young people in ways they think are most appealing, which young people will find engaging and more likely to take notice of.

Students Jessica Howard, Rhea Andrews and Erin Keith produced an info presentation hosted on prezzi; their aim was to raise awareness of CSE and signpost others to support. Here's a few words from girls about what inspired their design and what they set out to achieve:

'As a group, we felt that CSE is a subject which should be more addressed to the public, especially to the younger generation. The reason we created this presentation was to raise more awareness and educate ourselves more on this matter. From making the presentation we have realised how CSE can affect individuals mentally and physically and how important it is for everyone to realise how this affects an individual and can change their life. We hope our presentation can help prevent CSE and hope it can help individuals who have gone through the phases of CSE, can open up about it and get help and guidance to get their life back on track and not have to worry.'

Hot Topic: Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE)



Do you know what CSE is? Can you spot the signs?

CSE is when young people U18 are drawn in to exploitative situations, contexts and relationships where they may be given 'something' for involvement in sexual activities (food, accommodation, drugs, alcohol, cigarettes, affection, gifts, money)

CSE can also happen through technology, often without the person realising they're being exploited; for example being persuaded to post/send sexual images and/or with no immediate payment/gifts/gain to the young person.

Adults who exploit young people take advantage of a power they have due to their age, gender, intellect, physical strength and financial position; violence and coercion is also be used to intimidate young people to do things they may not really want to do.

Yay.. summer holidays are here!!
Time to have fun, have adventures, see friends, catch up on sleep... and keep safe!

Whatever you're doing this summer it's important you think about keeping yourself, your property, and your friends safe!!

Follow our Safe4Summer advice to help you stay safe and have the best summer ever!!

Lock Up! If you're home alone make sure you check all windows and doors are shut and locked before you leave the house. Burglars like easy opportunities.

Who are you letting in? People often knock on the door during the day saying they need to read gas / electric meters or need to check the water. Don't let them into your home unless they have made an appointment or an adult is present, they may not be genuine. They do not have the right to come into your home so don't be pressured!!!

Party on! If you're going to a party think before you drink or take 'legal highs'. Under the influence, you're unlikely to make safe choices and others may exploit or hurt you.

Think of others It's not fun for neighbours or the local community if you're being loud, using bad language, being destructive or trying to intimidate people around you.

Connecting online Think about who you're speaking to online, people may not be who they say they are; their intention may be to befriend you to exploit you or harm you

Meeting new friends If you want to meet with someone you've met online, discuss this with a parent or trusted adult first so they can help you make a safe choice.
